Office Block for Fire Station

Part of Sheffield's Central Fire Station is eventually to be demolished and a new office block and A.F.S. garage built on the site.

Work on a section of the Division Street main building is not expected to start until early in 1967.

The first stage of alterations is revealed in a Fire Brigade Committee recommendation to the City Council, that offices formerly occupied by the Fire Prevention Department, be converted into a lecture and study room.

This would be carried out by civilian workmen employed by the Brigade, at an estimated cost £490.

The existing lecture and study rooms at Brigade headquarters are in the section affected by the proposed alterations.

Chief Fire Officer Mr. Stanley Lambert told *The Star* today: "This new lecture room, and study room proposal is by way of an insurance against when the existing ones are pulled down.

"It should be ready to move straight into."
